What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Dimensional Global Bond Sustainability PIE Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. FundRock NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Objective: The Fund is managed to gain exposure to a broadly diversified portfolio of eligible intermediate term, Investment Grade global fixed interest and money market securities. Within portfolio constraints, including controls on portfolio maturity, security maturity, credit quality and diversification, the objective of the Fund is to maximise the return of the portfolio.

The Fund also takes into account certain non-financial Sustainability Considerations when making investment decisions. The Fund has a Portfolio Carbon Footprint Reduction Goal and seeks to exclude companies involved in particular business practices.

The Fund is not managed with the objective of achieving a particular return relative to a benchmark index.

Strategy: Ordinarily the Fund gets exposure to a diverse portfolio of Investment Grade corporate and government global fixed interest securities, with a maximum maturity of twenty years from the date of settlement. Dimensional generally changes the portfolio's exposure to term risk and credit risk in response to changes in security prices, while keeping the portfolio's overall weighted average duration similar to the overall weighted average duration of the global bond market.

The Fund intends to achieve this exposure by investing in funds and/or directly in fixed interest securities. The Fund may also hold cash or cash equivalent securities, and currency hedging instruments.

What are the risks of investing? See note 1

The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.


Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund when the fund received its first contribution, 20 November 2024 and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period to 30 June 2025, Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$290 (that is 2.90% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a return after tax of \$210 for the period.

Actual Investment Mix




Foreign currency exposure was 99.00% hedged to New Zealand dollars as at 30 June 2025

Notes

1. A combination of actual fund returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the fund has not been operating for the required five years. Market index returns have been used until 19 November 2024 and fund returns thereafter. The risk indicator may therefore provide a less reliable indicator of the fund's future volatility.
2. As the fund has not completed a full scheme year as at 31 March 2025, historical fee information is not available.
3. As the fund has not existed for a full year, figures in this example are based on returns from the date of the inception date.
4. Country is the country of exposure. Credit rating agencies Moody's Investor Service, Fitch Ratings, and Standard & Poor's Corporation rate the credit quality of debt issues. For reporting purposes, generally a composite rating based on stated ratings from Nationally Recognised Statistical Ratings Organizations ("NRSROs") is assigned. For example, if Moody's, Fitch, and S&P all provide ratings, a median rating is assigned. In certain instances, such as Pre-Refunded Municipal Bonds and US Treasury and Agency securities, an internal rating is assigned by the investment manager, which can only be as high as the highest stated credit rating from an NRSRO.
